COFFEE ROASTERS PARTNER WITH WREN TO PRODUCE NEW SPECIALTY

Speciality Wadebridge coffee roasters 'Hands-On Coffee', have added a new taste to their range.

Kernow Karma is freshly roasted in small batches and sold in 100% compostable bags, with a 10p donation to WREN.

Beans are organically grown in Peru by a women's cooperative supported by charity Café Femenino, and the UK importer also makes a donation to UK women's charities.

Eloise Travis from Hands-On Coffee explains: "Most coffee sold in the UK is roasted in enormous quantities and sold in bags made from plastics and aluminium.

"We roast in small batches each week to have a head start when it comes to freshness. And now we use a bag that's fully compostable.

"Partnering with WREN is a great way to help promote the benefits of a low carbon approach," adds Eloise. "It's a great fit for us as a small independent coffee roaster to work with WREN who are based in the same town and have a growing national recognition for their work."

WREN chair Stephen Frankel said "WREN is delighted to be involved with this initiative. A key purpose is to help local businesses benefit from the opportunities presented by the low carbon economy.

"And we are, of course, delighted by this contribution to our community fund."
