Not the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting

The AGM was held on 30th September, in Wadebridge Town Hall, attended by 53 members. As well as the usual formal proceedings – adoption of the annual accounts, reappointment of the auditor, election of directors – the main event of the evening was, of course, tea and cake.

Chair Stephen Frankel outlined WREN's achievements and what is to come. In a messy regulatory environment in which government departments send conflicting messages about renewables and community energy, WREN has nevertheless established itself with over 1,000 members (and still growing), the Energy Shop, and numerous awards. WREN has helped over 150 households and businesses improve energy efficiency and procured around 1MW of solar PV and a further 1MW of renewable heat.

WREN is now embarking on phase two, having its own generating capacity through the Wadebridge Energy Company. This not-for-profit co-operative will be owned by the community through a local share issue and initially will install solar PV on people's roofs, getting the feed in tariff while providing free electricity to the resident. The company will pay a return to shareholders and cover operating expenses, with any surplus revenue going to the WREN community fund to benefit community projects and organisations.

WREN is also collaborating with South West Water to build a 100kW solar PV array in part of a field next to the Nanstallon sewage treatment works, supplying all the generated electricity to the works.

Stephen's statement was followed by questions and discussion, and the meeting closed after a creditable hour and ten minutes, at

Wadebridge Energy Company

As mentioned under the AGM heading, **we are looking for suitable roofs** in the Wadebridge area on which the Wadebridge Energy Company can install solar PV panels. The resident under the roof will pay nothing and receive free electricity from the panels. The company will receive the feed in tariff.

The Wadebridge Energy Company will soon be looking **to issue shares to local people**, so that the community will be the owners of the company. Shareholders will receive a return on their investment that is better than bank savings accounts, possibly up to 6%. The money they invest will be used to purchase and install the solar panels on roofs and at the South West Water Nanstallon sewage treatment works.

Middle Treworder Solar Farm Fund Awards

£10,000 from the Middle Treworder solar farm has been awarded to eight community groups in the Wadebridge area.

23 organisations from Wadebridge, St Kew, St Mabyn and Egloshayle applied and the fund committee, made up of representatives from the town and parish councils, the landowner and WREN, had a hard task to select the winners.

The top three awards went to the Skateboard and BMX Park project (£5,000), Wadebridge Swimming Club to train more coaches (£2,400) and St Kew Highway Football Club for a ride-on mower to improve the quality of pitches (£1,000). Smaller awards went to Badger Forest School, The Muddy Puddle initiative at Wadebridge Primary Academy, U3A loud-speakers to aid the hard of hearing, Churches Together Holiday Club and Mothers' Milk Café.

The funding comes from a Section 106 agreement with the owners of the solar farm, infrastructure investment fund BBIP, and the land owners, Andrew, Shaun and Oliver Hawkey, to provide a community fund to benefit residents of the area around the installation. The fund is administered by WREN, but is separate from our own Community Fund. A further £20,000 is due in April 2015 with more to come in the years after that.

Chair of the fund committee and WREN director, Tony Faragher, said, "It is very pleasing to see that BBIP and the Hawkey family have so promptly honoured their Section 106 commitment to provide the money for this community fund. They provide a great example for other solar and wind developers."

WREN, in association with Bridge Tools, has arranged a bulk purchase of LED light bulbs in various fitting types. This allows us to offer significantly reduced prices for these bulbs. Using 90% less energy than old incandescent bulbs, whilst giving immediate full brightness, they are fast becoming the favoured low energy bulb. They have an average lifetime of 30,000 hours, a 3 year guarantee and the cost will be paid back through reduced energy bills.

The bulbs are of high quality, manufactured by NGPS, and emit a warm white light. They give a safe low heat and contain no harmful chemicals. Displays can be seen in both the Energy Shop and Bridge Tools (at the bottom of Gonvena Hill).
